Camp Bethesda was a turning point in Matt's life. His parents, Angela and Calvin, were nervous the first time he went to camp a few years ago—he had never been away from home before. At the end of the week when they heard how well he had done, their hearts swelled with pride.

"I remember listening to the counselors say how supportive Matt was of the other campers," Angela recalls. "He encouraged them to get involved in things that maybe they would never get involved in. I thought, 'Wow, that's our son making others feel happy and included.""


Calvin adds, "He's very social, he loves music and dancing. To hear that he was stepping into a leadership role was incredible. Camp gave him an outlet to show a side of himself we hadn't seen before."

At Camp Bethesda, Matt thrived in the structured activities, forming strong friendships and developing new skills. The

experience of being away from home, surrounded by peers and caring staff, gave him a newfound sense of independence and confidence. He reminisces about epic waterfights, singing songs, and cheering with his friends during group activities. "I love the games and music," he says. "It's my favorite time of the year."

Since attending camp, Matt has grown into an outgoing and engaged young man. While his time in Bethesda's community inclusion program continues to support his development, it was the camp experience that truly opened a door for him. "Everybody wants the best for their child," Calvin says. "Bethesda gave Matt opportunities we couldn't provide alone. Seeing his abilities flourish and knowing he has hope for the future—it's more than we could have asked for."

Bethesda has hosted a family support group in Abbotsford for years. This January, we partnered with Southridge Community Church to start another one in Langley. With Southridge providing childcare, snacks, and space, and Bethesda offering leadership, a meaningful partnership has formed.

# Rising Costs of Camp: Why We're Asking for More This Year

Bethesda will once again be hosting Camp Bethesda, a week-long overnight summer camp, at Camp Stillwood near Cultus Lake. Summer camp has been operating since the 1970's in one form or another, and has served hundreds of people with diverse abilities and their families.

Camp Bethesda is first and foremost a respite service for families. Parents drop off their adult son or daughter for a 6 day, fun-filled and inclusive camp experience. While the campers have a great time, many parents have shared that this is the only time of the year that they get to take a vacation as a couple, or to invest in their other children who have often had to take a backseat to the needs of their siblings with diverse abilities.

In recent years, the cost of all camps has aggressively risen: the cost of the camp facility, meals, and activities have grown by 107% over the last two years. Since all the costs are covered by donations, Bethesda has set a new donation target of \$300,000 to ensure we are able to maintain our commitment to these families. When you donate, you're not just giving financially—you're creating community. You are making it possible for families


to find encouragement in a support group, for children to experience the joy of summer camp, and for people to build friendships, join Camp Bethesda and live independently. You are part of this story of love in action.
